

Preliminary itinerary for NAU in Denmark 2010 by Knud Ib Christensen

- 10th August **ARRIVAL** at Hotel Marina in Vedbæk.
Take the regional train to Helsingør (Elsinore) from terminal 3 in Copenhagen Airport Kastrup and get off at Vedbæk railway station. I hope to pick you up there and drive you to the hotel.
- 11th August **SYMPOSIUM**
Exotic woody plant species – a threat to natural habitats in the Nordic region?
- Botanical Garden, Copenhagen**
Tour in the national botanical garden of Denmark dating back to August the 2nd, 1600.
- Forest Botanical Garden, Charlottenlund**
Many first-introductions to Denmark, and the oldest arboretum in the country.
- 12th August **Borsholm Pinetum**
Good private pinetum with unusual and rare conifers.
- Rusland (“Russia”)**
Moor and forest with most of the commonly cultivated trees in Danish forestry.
- The Pinetum of Mogens Carlo Hansen**
Good private pinetum with many conifers and some wintergreen hardwoods.
- The Arboretum, Hørsholm**
The National Arboretum of Denmark.
- Jægersborg Deer Park** (if we have the time)
Many old and named individuals of *Quercus robur*, Raunkiær’s *Crataegus* taxa, remnants from the first organised forest plantings in Denmark (von Langen’s plantations with *Larix decidua*, etc.).
- 13th August **Stensbygaard, Stensbyvej 52, Stensved**
The park of the manor of Stensbygaard owned by Allison and Niels Riegels is among the best and most varied of its kind in Denmark.
- Hesede Planteskole (Paradishave), Villa Gallinavej, Haslev**
Tour in the recently reconstructed nursery – or rather arboretum. Many first-introductions to Denmark, e.g., *Pinus peuce* in 1859.

14th August

Sorø Academy

Tour in the park with an introduction to the history of the Sorø Academy.

The Burser Garden at the Museum of Sorø

Tour in the recently reconstructed garden of the renowned pharmacist and botanist Joachim Burser (1583-1639) who was also Professor at Sorø Academy.

Forest of Suserup Skov

Walk through a semi-natural, “untouched” species-rich deciduous forest.

15th August

The NAU 2010 meeting ends after breakfast in the hotel.
